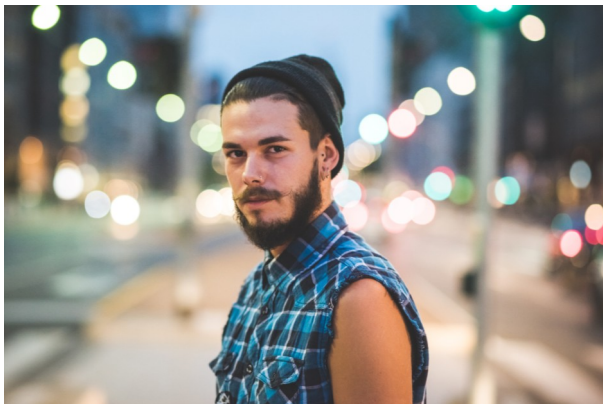

PrEP

Protect yourself from HIV



PrEP may be right for you if you:

- do not have HIV
- are at risk of getting HIV through sex or using or sharing needles
- have a partner who has HIV

Your HIV risk depends on the kinds of sex you have, your partners, and your health.

Talk to your doctor to see if PrEP is right for you.



PrEP + condoms

Use condoms along with PrEP.



- Condoms give you even more protection against HIV.
- PrEP only helps prevent HIV. Condoms can protect you from other STIs (infections you can get from sex) and pregnancy.

Paying for PrEP

- Medicaid and many other insurances cover PrEP.
- If you don't have insurance, you may be able to get help paying for PrEP.
- You do not have to be a U.S. citizen to get PrEP at CHN.

PrEP is **not** an emergency pill. If you think you were exposed to HIV in the last few days, ask us about **PEP**.
